Overview

- ***NEW*** data collection
- Maintenance of Effort Reduction (MOE)
- Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS)
- FFY 2009
- Due date is May 1, 2011

MOE Reduction

IDEA allows, with certain exceptions, an LEA to reduce its level of state and local expenditures (otherwise known as “maintenance of effort”) by not more than 50 percent of the amount of the excess for any fiscal year for which the allocation received by the LEA exceeds the amount the LEA received for the previous fiscal year.

(20 U.S.C. 1413(a)(2)(C)(i) & 34 CFR §300.205(a))

Voluntary use of CEIS

IDEA allows an LEA to use not more than 15% of the amount the LEA receives under Part B of the Act for any fiscal year in combination with other amounts (which may include amounts other than education funds) to develop and implement CEIS.

(20 U.S.C. 1413(f)(1) & 34 CFR §300.226)

Voluntary use of CEIS (cont.)

IDEA requires each LEA that develops and maintains CEIS to annually report to the SEA on the number of children served under this section who received CEIS; and the number of children served under this section who received CEIS and subsequently received special education and related services under Part B of the Act during the preceding two year period.

(20 U.S.C. 1413(f)(4) & 34 CFR §300.226(d))

Required use of CEIS

IDEA requires any LEA identified to have significant disproportionality to reserve the maximum amount of funds under section 613(f) to provide comprehensive CEIS to serve children in the LEA, particularly children in those groups that were significantly overidentified.

(20 U.S.C. 1418 (d) & 34 CFR §300.646(b)(2))



Overview of Data Elements

Report on every LEA and ESA that receives Section 611 or 619 subgrant

- A. LEA/ESA 611 and 619 allocations for FFY 2008 and 2009
- B. MOE reduction
- C. Provision of CEIS
- D. Number of children who received CEIS in past two years and then received special education and related services in 2009-10

TA on Data Elements

- Following the public comment periods, OSEP made a number of changes and clarifications.
- DAC is collecting questions about the data elements and will provide answers as soon as possible.

Data Entry

- DAC is developing a web-based data entry and submission system that looks very similar to the OMB table.
- Instructions for data entry will be included.
- The system will be checked and optimized for accessibility and 508 compliance.
- SEAs will receive a username and password.
- LEA names and IDs will be preloaded from NCES membership list.

Data Entry (cont.)

- If requested by an SEA, LEAs may enter data directly. This is an OPTION, not a requirement.
- If the LEAs enter data, the SEA will be responsible for distributing usernames and passwords to LEAs.

Data Entry (cont.)

- If the LEAs enter data, only the LEAs will be able to edit their data.
- If the LEAs enter their data, the SEA will be able to view a summary of where their LEAs are in the process of data entry.
- LEAs will indicate to the SEA when their data entry is complete, after which they will not be able to enter or edit their data without having the data unlocked by the SEA.

Data Entry (cont.)

- If the SEA enters all state data, the SEA will enter all data from LEAs from a single user account.
- If the SEA chooses to enter all state data, the SEA will be able to enter and edit any of the LEA-level data.

Data Entry (cont.)

- LEAs or SEAs may enter data in sections of Table 8 as the data become available and save a *draft* for later completion of the full table.

Data Submission

- When tables from all LEAs are complete and ready for submission, the SEA must click the “submit” button.
- Once the SEA submits its data, neither the SEA nor the LEAs will be able to edit their data without having it reopened by DAC.

Data Submission (cont.)

- DAC will provide a data template for those SEAs that want to upload a data file.
- SEAs that upload a data file will need to make their data conform to the data template format.
- There will be a facility on the web site for securely uploading data files.

Data Checks and Validation

- The system will be programmed to conduct checks for inconsistencies or errors, notify users of any errors, and prompt data corrections.
- SEAs submitting through the web-based system and SEAs uploading files will receive reports to indicate data were loaded/uploaded or there are errors, as applicable.

Data Checks and Validation (cont.)

- DAC will build more edit checks into the system that align with the instructions as OSEP has more information about data use.

Pilot of Web System

- DAC will pilot the web-based data entry and submission system in the Fall 2010.
