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#### **SiMR Baseline Data**





### What Are Baseline Data for the SSIP?

- Baseline data provide information about:
  - Child performance before implementation of improvement strategies
  - Characteristics of your identified group of children or students relevant to your SiMR
- Examples are:
  - Child outcomes aligned with Indicator C3
  - Family outcomes aligned with Indicator C4
  - Preschool outcomes aligned with Indicator B7
  - School outcomes aligned with Indicator B3

### **Importance of Baseline**

- Baseline serves as a point of reference, allowing demonstration of change over time.
  - Determine the amount of growth that is expected each FFY reporting period target setting
  - Compare baseline data to data collected at later points in time
  - Determine progress towards targets



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### **Data Sources**

- 1. Agency controlled data are...
  - readily accessed & controlled
  - familiar with content & use
  - reported on & analyzed specific to the SSIP
- 2. Data that belong to another entity...
  - may be the best data for a state's SiMR
  - require a strong and trusting relationship
  - require confidence regarding quality, accessibility, and timeliness of the data
  - may be useful for SiMR baseline and targets



### Data Sources (cont.)

3. Primary data collection needed when the agency...

- does not currently have
- does not know of existing
- needs to develop a new data collection effort

### **Baseline Questions**

- Are the data of high quality?
- Are the data reliable?
- Are the data valid?
- Are there plans to improve the data quality?
  - If so, how?
- Will the data quality affect the baseline and targets?




### **Baseline Questions (cont.)**

- What do the data show about children or students statewide?
- What do the data show about children or students by race, ethnicity, special education, general education, educational environment, geographic area, etc.?
- Are there patterns in the data (i.e., are there subgroups that have a mean higher, lower, or the same as the state)?
- How do subgroups compare with each other?
- Will the differences affect the determination of targets?



### **SiMR Targets**



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### What Is a Target for the SSIP?

- Targets...
  - are values of the SiMR expressed as percentages
  - reflect expectations for each reporting period
  - are set based on known baseline values
  - engage & reflect stakeholders input
  - are both rigorous & attainable
  - support providers, teachers, administrators, and stakeholders in comparing the amount of progress made by children and students to the projected values



### **Setting Targets**

- Targets are best based on the first year of <u>quality</u> data collected, not necessarily the first year of data.
- Are the targets for pilot programs?
- If you have plans to scale-up implementation, have you considered any possible impact of scale-up on targets?
- If you are selecting subgroups, have you considered using the baselines of the individual groups to set their targets?

### **Considerations for Changing Baselines**

- 1. The baseline data are not representative.
- 2. State or local programs have out-of-range data.

Problems with...

- a) data collection methods
- b) data reporting or data system errors
- c) particular data collection tool
- 3. Changing data collection tools &/or methods



## **Considerations for Changing Targets**

- 1. Changes in baseline
  - a) Baseline changed to give more accurate picture
  - b) Revised baseline may be higher or lower than original baseline
  - c) Growth projected from more accurate baseline



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### **3 Situations to Set Revised Targets**

- 1. The state's baseline was revised to reflect more accurate data.
- 2. Data from early implementers were not as expected.
- 3. The state used data from evidence-based practice reports to estimate targets, but the adapted activities for the state yielded different growth in outcomes measures.

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
