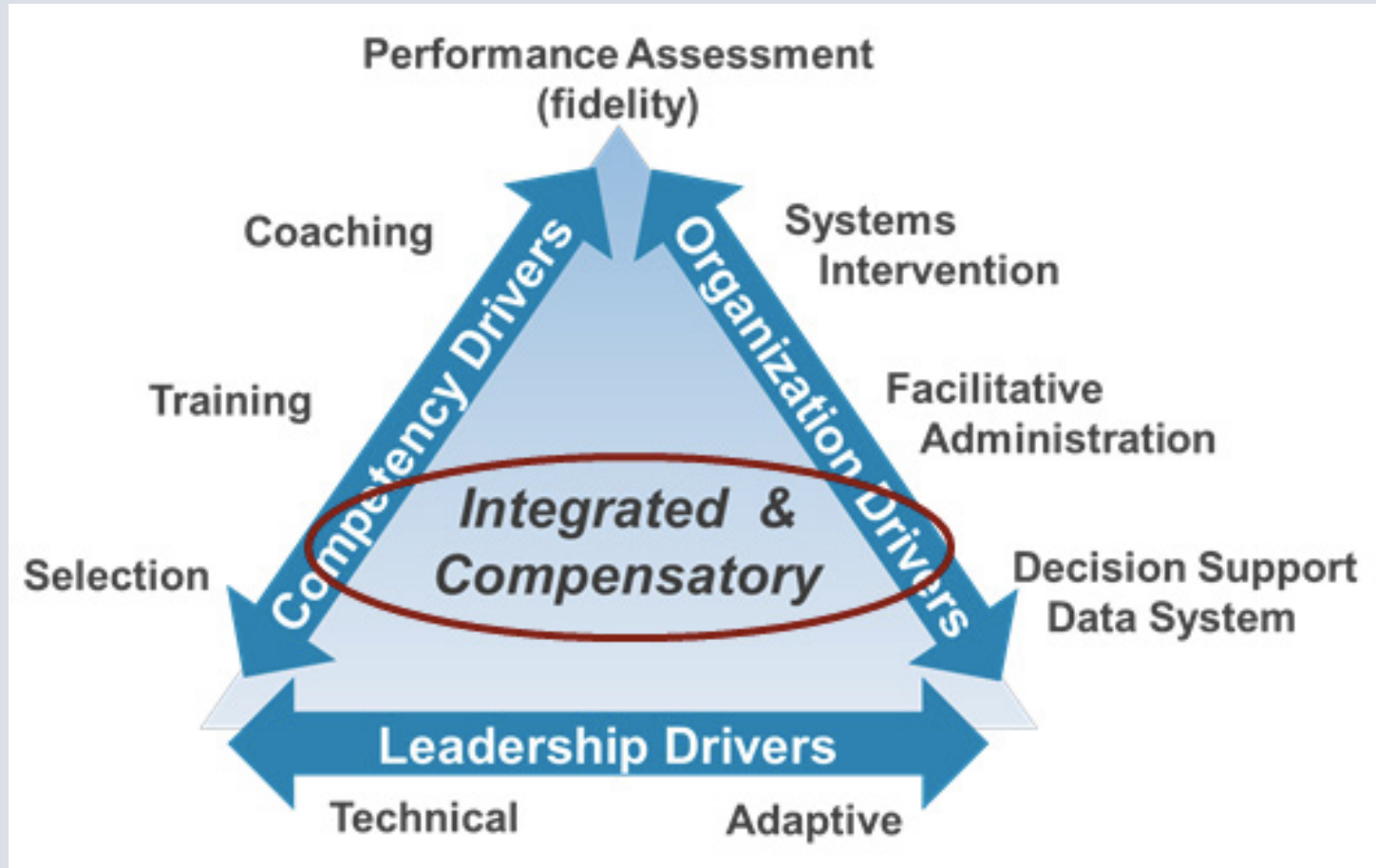

Implementation Drivers



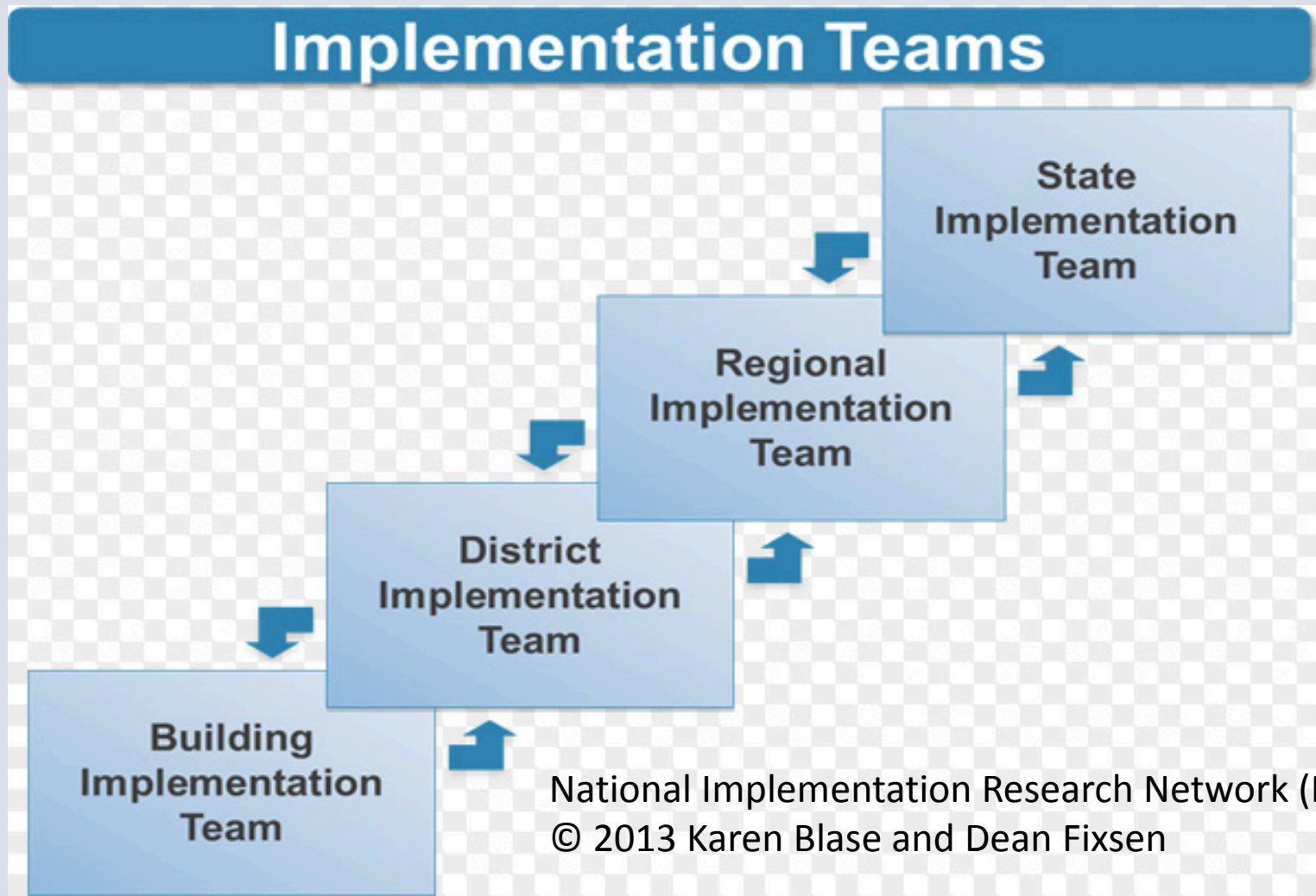
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Implementation Drivers

Research on Implementation Teams show that they decrease time to achieve high-quality delivery of selected innovations AND increase the number of practitioners or sites using selected innovations with fidelity.

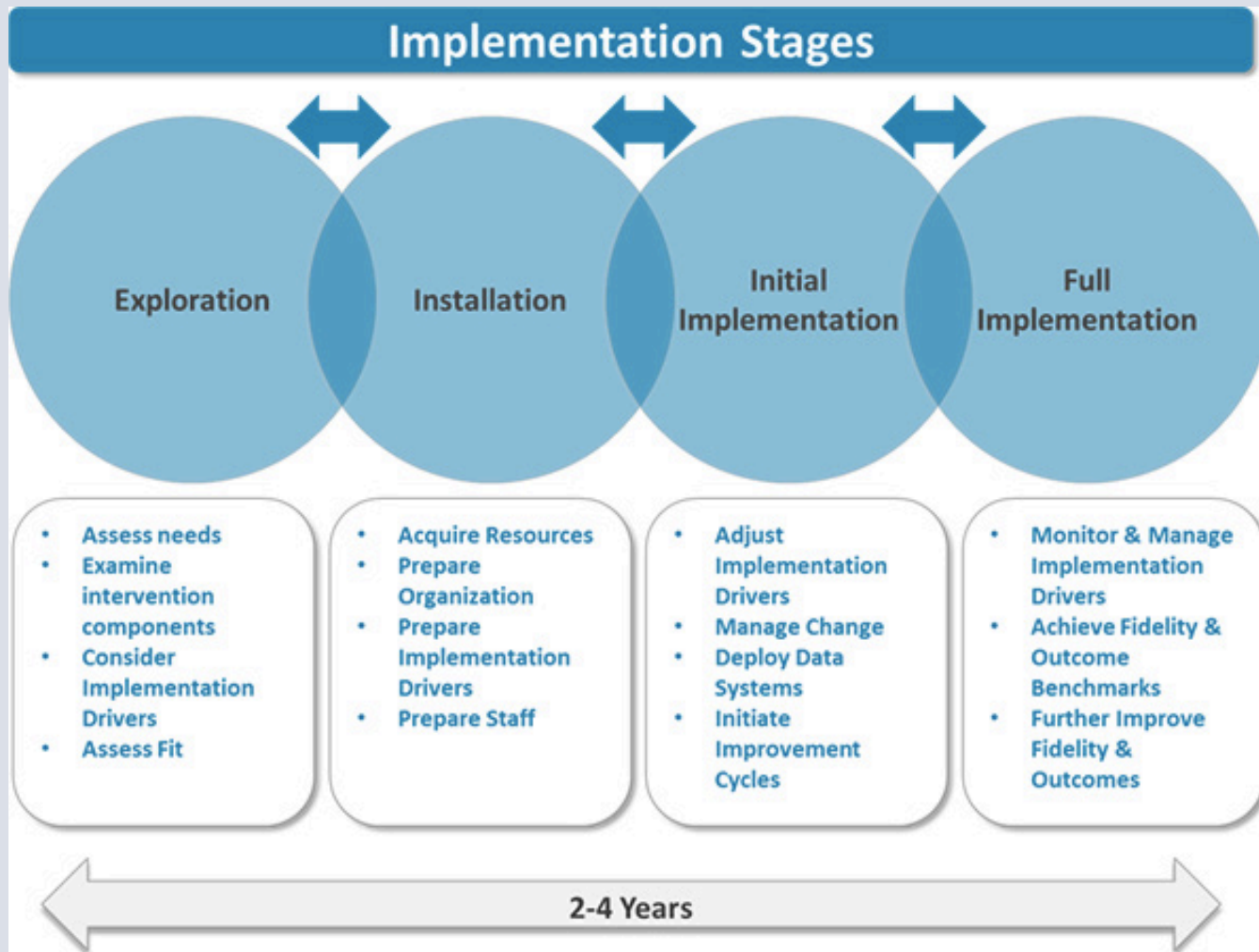

Stages of Implementation



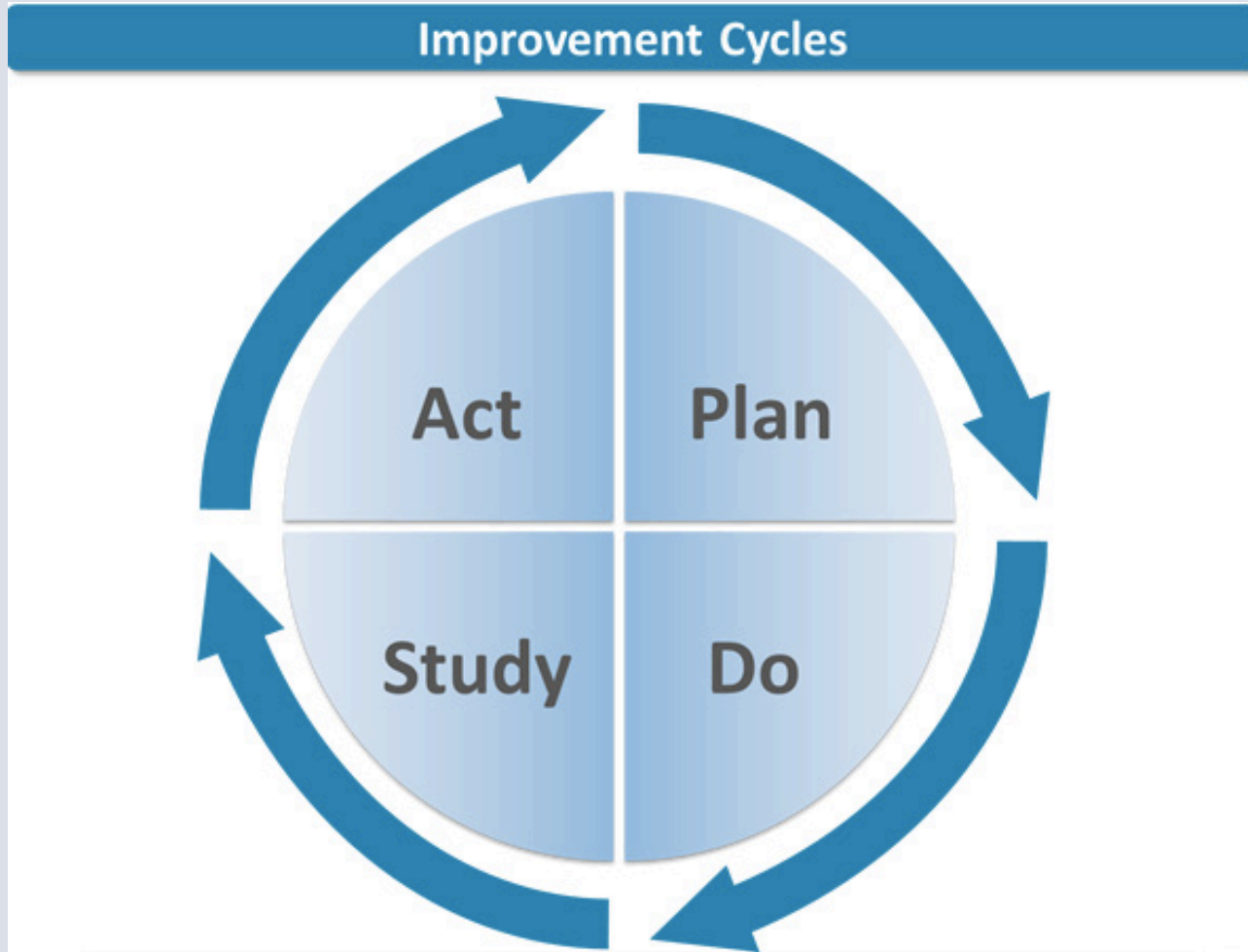
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Stages of Implementation
