TA on Sampling Plans

- Background
 - Indicators for which sampling is allowed: B7, B8, B14, C3, C4, as well as C11 and B17
 - States need to submit sampling plans to OSEP if making a change in the plan or switching to sampling on C3, C4, B7, B8, and B14 — due February 2015.
 - Sampling plans for C11 and B17 due to OSEP April 2015.
- IDC is available for technical assistance on sampling, including reviewing your state's changed or new sampling plan before you submit to OSEP.

TA on Sampling Plans

- When to adjust your sampling plan – Some examples:
 - Across and within LEAs, changes, additions, deletions, redefinitions – consider effect on previous approved strategy, rotation plan, etc.
 - Extremely large / small units that did not exist before
 - Sample sizes may need to change
 - Representativeness - demographic changes within the state
 - Size of LEAs may have changed

TA on Sampling Plans

- Other circumstances that might lead to having a sampling plan to review
 - Expected response rates may have changed over years.
 - Sampling strategy may take the place of a census with a low response rate.
