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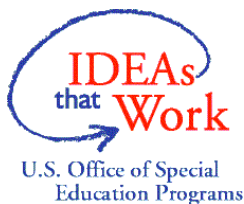

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## Introduction

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Section 618 requires that states publicly report data related to the following collections: Child Count and Settings, Dispute Resolution, and Exiting. States commonly meet this requirement by posting these data to agency websites.

The *IDEA* Data Center (IDC) has developed this tool to assist states in auditing, organizing, and recording progress on compliance with these public reporting requirements. States may also use this tool to document the URL, date, and any relevant notes for each data posting.

This tool lists each Section 618 data collection and the subgroups by which the collection is required to be disaggregated and publicly reported. To organize the work and record progress, complete the checklist and document the posting details (URL, date, and relevant notes) as each collection is posted. Record summary information in the Quick Reference Chart.

Due consideration and action toward maintaining student privacy must be maintained when publicly reporting these data.
