IDEA Data Quality Review and Year to Year Reports posted to MAX.gov

State reviews report and resubmits data if needed

State submits data note as required

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

Year to Year Report







Why Data Notes?

- Provide meaningful context for interpreting data and understanding the limitations of the data within the state education agency (SEA) and for the public
- Address OSEP's questions regarding the data or potential compliance issues
- Provide explanations of substantial changes from the previous year



Tips for Responding to OSEP's Comments



- Carefully review OSEP's comments for
 - A clear understanding of the concern
 - Information to guide the state's response
- Respond to the specific content of the comment
 - Address each issue specified
 - Do not address issues OSEP did not identify





Guiding Questions for Analysis

Use the comments as the basis for a root cause analysis to determine the reason for the data issues. Questions may include the following:

- Was the correct version of the data file submitted?
- Were errors made in collection, validation, and review of reported data?
- Were errors made in creating the data submission files?
- Were any data missing or duplicated?



Guiding Questions for Analysis (cont.)



- Were there policy or procedure changes in the state or individual local education agencies (LEAs) that may have impacted the data?
- Were there data definitions or processes that were unclear or that were applied inconsistently?
- Were there changes in the SEA staff who provide the data?
- Were there year to year fluctuations in individual LEA data?





Summarize Findings

- Include issues from the root cause analysis in the data note
- If data need to be resubmitted, identify steps the state took to make corrections
- If data are correct as submitted, explain why the data are correct, including any year to year fluctuations










Part B and C Landing Page and State-Specific Links






















Data Quality and Year to Year Reports









Data Note Best Practices

Briefly describe the issue and a general explanation of why the data issue occurred.

 Public users of the data will not see OSEP's comments, only your response; restating the concern provides clarity for the data note





Data Note Best Practices (cont.)

Note policy changes at the state or local level that may have impacted how data are reported to the state.

 For example, a change in state policy around graduation requirements could impact the number of students with disabilities receiving a certificate





Data Note Best Practices (cont.)

Note additional training that may have led to substantial changes in the data from the prior year.

 For example, additional training on proper coding for disciplinary removals could result in changes in the counts for some removal categories





Data Note Best Practices (cont.)

Describe any unusual circumstances that may have impacted the collection of data.

- Use of a new data collection system with additional edit checks that improve data quality
- Natural disasters or data system failures that may impact data quality
