OSEP Memo 09-02: Reporting on Correction of Noncompliance in the Annual Performance Report Required Under Sections 616 and 642 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act	The memorandum, dated October 17, 2008, commonly referred to as "OSEP Memo 09-02," outlines how states must report and verify corrections of noncompliance for relevant indicators in the SPP/APR.

<u>Building Your SPP/APR Stakeholder</u> <u>Engagement Plan: 10 Essential Questions</u>	This resource guides states through 10 key questions they should be asking themselves as they build their stakeholder engagement plans. Each question includes detailed options to consider that will assist states in preparing to describe their engagement activities in their SPPs/APRs.	
<u>Checklist to Identify and Address SSIP Data</u> <u>Quality Issues</u>	This checklist can help state staff who are responsible for the State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) apply the principles of high-quality data to the identification of data quality issues that the state should report. The checklist includes questions that states can ask themselves to recognize data quality issues that may exist. It provides the potential consequences of these issues and offers suggested actions that states can take to address the issues.

States can use this excerpt to inform state staff and other SPP/APR planning partners about stakeholder involvement that states must include in their FFY 2020–2025 Part B SPP/APR introduction.
<u>Graduation Rate (Indicator 1) and Dropout</u> <u>Rate (Indicator 2) Calculator</u>	This resource calculates graduation and dropout rates using the 618 Exiting data. The tool can accumulate and graph multiple years of data, allowing users to observe trends in the rates over time and share the information easily with stakeholders.

<u>IDEA Part B Federal Reporting Years</u> <u>Reference</u>	This resource illustrates the differences among school year (SY), federal fiscal year (FFY), and calendar year (CY)—that is, types of years—as they relate to data that states collect and report to meet their Part B IDEA federal reporting requirements.
<u>Parent Involvement Data: How to Measure</u> <u>and Improve Representativeness for Indicator</u> <u>B8</u>	This interactive resource provides states with an overview of how to gather representative parent involvement data for Part B SPP/APR Indicator 8. The resource defines key concepts such as representativeness, sampling, nonresponse bias, response rates, and weighting. It also offers information on how to improve the quality of parent involvement data, including strategies that can help states collect representative data as well as evaluate and improve the representativeness of their data.
Part B Indicator Data Display Wizard	This resource helps state education agency (SEA) staff communicate complex data to stakeholders in a more user-friendly manner. The tool creates data visualizations, in the form of charts, based on the SPP/APR data that users enter.
SPP/APR Indicator Cards	This resource provides brief descriptions of Part B indicators and the list of IDEA 618 data collections for quick reference.
SPP/APR Indicator Sampling Plan Checklist	This interactive self-assessment tool can help states determine whether their sampling plan addresses OSEP's sampling requirements for best practice and to identify action steps to improve their sampling procedures.
<u>SPP/APR Target Setting Toolkit</u>	This toolkit is a series of eight Excel workbooks designed to assist states as they set targets for their SPP/APR. Each tool presents five different target setting methodologies that states can use to develop, discuss, and, ultimately, set measurable and rigorous targets, as required by IDEA.

States can use the <u>Organizer Template for Part B SPP/APR</u> <u>Target Setting</u> to briefly document information for consideration when setting new SPP/APR targets. States can supplement this overview template with the <u>Indicator Organizer for Part B SPP/APR</u> <u>Stakeholder Involvement and Target Setting</u> , which they can use to capture more detailed information on stakeholder involvement in setting targets for individual SPP/APR indicators.
<u>Unpacking and Understanding Part B</u> <u>SPP/APR Indicator 3D</u>	This resource guides the reader through Indicator 3D, including how to calculate it; information on the setting/resetting of its baselines and targets; and considerations when analyzing, reporting, and using Indicator 3D data.
